Deposits can be mailed directly to the Bloomington North band office. I ask that if you plan to march, please take a few moments to go over the attached schedule and mark your calendars now. Consistent attendance is crucial to our success as a marching band.

## 1. How important is attendance at rehearsals and contests?

Attendance is **mandatory** at all rehearsals and contests. We ask that you plan family events, vacations, and work schedules around the marching band calendar. Each band member contributes a piece of the puzzle at rehearsal. Attendance at band camp is mandatory and extremely crucial to the success of our season. Parents are encouraged to attend any and all rehearsals and performances.

# 2. When does the band rehearse during the school year? Do you practice after school every day?

**NO WAY!!** The Cougar Band does have August rehearsals, but people still take summer vacations and attend summer camps in June and July. When school starts and you need more time for school work, we only practice **TWO SCHOOL NIGHTS PER WEEK**. Our regular season rehearsal schedule begins on August 8th. We only rehearse every Tuesday and Thursday night from 6-9pm.

#### 3. When and what is band camp?

Band camp is July 22nd-26th (Monday thru Friday). It is held at Bloomington High School North. This week is when we learn as much of our competitive show as possible. Band members are to bring their own lunch while our band boosters provide dinner. Students should wear light colored clothing, socks, comfortable broken in athletic shoes, (no sandals) and lots of sun block. Everyone should also have a personal water cooler brought to each day of band camp for water breaks.



## 4. When and where does the band perform and compete?

Starting on September 14th, the Cougar Band travels to various high schools around the state of Indiana. At these schools we perform in invitational competitions to help clean and perfect our show. We also perform at all home football games. The Indiana State School Music Association Regional competition will be held October 12th. The top 10 scoring bands at that site advance to the Semi-State competition held on October 26th. The top 10 scoring band out of 20 moves on to the State Finals held on November 9th at Lucas Oil Stadium!

## 5.Does marching band meet during the school day?

No. The Cougar Band is a completely extra-curricular band class. However, students do receive .5 credit for being a member. Grades are based on attendance and participation. Please make sure this class appears on their schedule. This credit is optional and not required!

# 6.Will I have time for my homework if I do marching band? How busy will I be? I'm worried about my grades!

Being a successful student and also a member of the Cougar Band is all about time management. Many band members get their best grades of the school year during marching band season. Band members are encouraged to manage their time wisely and plan ahead with their school work. We have MANY students participating in advanced placement coursework and we have had several Valedictorians and Salutatorians in the marching band! Being a member of the Cougar Band is time well spent!

## 7. What instrument can I play in marching band?

Band members can play all typical band instruments except for oboe and bassoon. Double reed players typically learn to play another instrument for marching band such as clarinet, saxophone, mellophone, or baritone. We do march bass clarinets and baritone saxophones.

# **COUGAR BAND FEES - HOW ARE MY DUES SPENT?**

Our Bloomington North Band Booster Association is very supportive of our marching band. This group of dedicated parents works tirelessly to raise the necessary funds to continue our tradition of excellence that is the trademark of all BHSN Bands. It takes approximately \$65k to put our competitive marching band on the field every year. This comes to roughly \$480 per band member. Based on our estimates for the 2024 enrollment, each member of the 2024 Cougar Band will be required to pay a \$300 fee for their first child, and \$275 for each additional child.

This covers roughly half of the cost of our season, which costs include:

- Show design(music and drill)
- Instructors
- Contest Fees
- Food for band camp and contest days
- Transportation Instrument/Equipment purchases.

(This does not include certain out-of-pocket expenses for individual students, like instrument rental, shoes, gloves, section t-shirts, photographs, and individual overnight trip expenses)



To help earn the additional monies needed to field the show, each student has the opportunity to raise funds through our annual August March-A-Thon. Please visit our band booster website at www.bhsnbands.

com and check out the information under "boosters". There you will find information on fund-raising and other various events that happen throughout the year. While on the BHSN Band web page, you'll also want to visit "Info for all bands" to learn about student band accounts.

Every student, upon joining band, is automatically signed up for a band account. Monies deposited here can be used to defray the cost of band fees, uniforming, instrument rental and trips. There are options given throughout the year for students to earn money for their accounts and many families utilize the "Band Bucks" program for this purpose.
